CBO Ad Hoc Committee Report



CBO Membership Survey Questions

- What do you value most from being a WACAC member as a CBO counselor?
- How can WACAC better serve CBO members?
- What factors contributed most to your departure? (former members)
- Is the cost of WACAC membership a barrier for your organization?

Themes

- Value: WACAC's supportive community, PD opportunities, network with CBO counselors and college admission staff
- Improve: More of the same but delivered in a more structured and organized way, not limited to events
- Barrier: Membership fee is the underlying barrier preventing CBO counselors from joining the organization

Special Election: FREE CBO MEMBERSHIP



Proposal:

Beginning July 1, 2021, annual membership dues for those that qualify for the “Not-for-profit community-based organization (CBO)” membership type, shall be free.

Section 4.04. Membership Dues.

1. Any change in the annual dues of WACAC shall be determined by the Executive Board and approved by a... majority of voting member ballots returned in an electronic ballot.

Section 5.07. Quorum and Action of the Members.

1. One-tenth (1/10) of the eligible voting members of WACAC shall constitute a quorum for voting purposes. (2,504 members = 250 constitute a quorum)

Section 5.08. Voting.

1. Each voting member shall be entitled to one (1) vote...
2. Only voting WACAC members who are in good standing on the day of any Membership Meeting or on the day an electronic ballot is sent may be entitled to vote on matters presented to the membership... Each voting member so entitled to vote shall have one vote on each matter presented for consideration. Voting members shall not be entitled to vote by proxy.

Section 6.05. Election and Term of Office

4. Election decisions shall be determined by a simple majority of ballots returned within 14 calendar days of the date of distribution of the electronic ballot.

ARTICLE XII. AMENDMENTS

1. The Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws may be amended by the voting members through electronic ballot. A two-thirds (2/3) affirmative vote on the ballots returned by the stated return date constitutes the decision to change amendments. (167 votes)

May 20th: Membership notified of Special Election

June 1st: Special Election ballot sent to members

June 7th: Free CBO Membership Forum

June 14th: Voting Closes EOD

June 18th: Voting results announced via email
